Did you know?

OF THE FRANCICO

The traditional incandescent light bulb (the one that cartoonists draw above the head to show an idea) is being phased out.

These bulbs are being replaced by compact fluorescent bulbs (cfl's) that are much more energy efficient and last much longer. They are typically spiraled tubes. You can now buy these bulbs just about anywhere including our tuck shop.

Within your suite there are several types of bulbs such as: tubes (kitchen), appliance (fridge, range hood, oven), globe (dining area) and standard base (hall, bedroom, porch).

When you first occupy your suite we (landlord) are responsible to have all these bulbs in working order. During the time that you (tenant) occupy the suite it is your responsibility and expense to replace any burnt out bulbs.

We are able to do this for you through our Handyman (John) service every weekend. The cost is a mere \$5 per light and includes the cost of the bulb.
